Hans Günter Brauch's Obituary on Klaus von Beyme

Prof. Dr. Klaus von Beyme, one of the globally most influential and most cited German political scientists and a major German public intellectual, has died on 6 December 2021 in the age of 87. He was one of my university professors in political science, the first adviser of my PhD thesis at Heidelberg University and my key examiner in political science during my oral PhD examination on 30 June 1976.

In 2013 he became one of my most distinguished authors of whom I published two English books on the occasion of his 80th birthday and two additional books that were translated from German in 2018 and 2019. We had considered to translate additional books, especially one of his key publications on political theory (1789 - 1945) focusing on liberalism, conservatism and socialism but I failed to raise the money for its translation. I still hope to publish an English translation of a biography of his comprehensive academic work by a young scholar.



Since 2013 we met regularly several times a year both in his office in his Institute of Political Science (IPW) and in his home in the Landfriedstraße in the centre of the old town of Heidelberg where his wife Maja von Beyme often invited me for lunch, afternoon coffee with cake or for dinner. Klaus and Maja von Beyme were guests at my 70th birthday party in Mosbach, close to Heidelberg, where he presented a poem he had composed in my honour. Already during the pandemic he attended on 13 July 2020 together with the second adviser of my thesis, Prof. Hartmut Soell, a ceremony when I was awarded the Federal Cross of Merit on Ribbon of the German Federal President by the lord major of Mosbach. My last visit in his apartment was on 6 November 2021 a month before he passed away peacefully in his home in the presence of his family,

During these eight years (2013-2021) he often told me episodes of his life, his family, of his career and of his present new academic interests and books he was writing. Until his mideighties he taught seminars at Heidelberg University, gave lectures and wrote each year a new book among them two for which I could raise funds for language editing and translation into English.

When I was hospitalised four times in a university clinic in 2019 he cared about my health and often called me to send me his best wishes for a full recuperation. As we experienced the same disease he asked me about my own experience and how I succeeded to become healthy again and to continue my editorial hobby as an independent external academic editor with Springer Nature.

In 2021 when he stopped writing and completing his last book on social democracy and when he told me that modern medicine could not help him anymore I became aware that when he had to give up what he had learned and knew best to write academic books and articles that his life was coming to an end. Between July and November 2021 his health situation declined rapidly but his mind remained fresh and he was still interested in my health

situation, in my editorial hobby and my most resent publications on a peace ecology and on the Anthropocene that started between 1940 and 1950 the decade of American policy I had analysed in my thesis on global structural change and the US leadership role of which he was the first adviser.

During these many private conversation I observed one of the most adored professors of generations of students in political science as a very polite, modest and caring person with principles of social justice he did not only address in his lectures and publications but practiced them towards his students avoiding both any favouritism or discrimination due to social classes and status. Being born into a noble family he practiced the goals and values of social democracy, a party of which he had been a member since 1958 for 63 years.

My distinguished author Klaus von Beyme gradually became a fatherly friend who gave me hope when I was struggling for my life not to give up and to look with confidence into the future. I followed his advice and have continued my editorial hobby once my own health situation had improved.

Klaus von Beyme has been both a highly respected, adored and hard-working, well organised, reliable, modest, amiable and focused public intellectual who participated in many discourses within his discipline of political science but who also shared his assessments in many policy debates. As one of the last geniuses and academic giants in political science he could read the literature in a majority European languages and integrate the results in his more than 50 monographs and more than 500 academic articles.

But he also analysed new issues areas of architecture, cultural policy and of the arts from a social science perspective. My fatherly friend Klaus who inspired many of his 100 PhD candidates, including myself, may rest in peace. I am both saddened about his death loosing with him one of my most distinguished authors and a fatherly caring friend.
